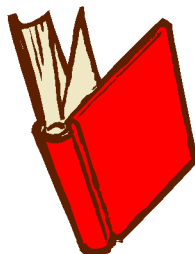

Children in grades 1-2 may enter the parade with a picture, depicting their favorite book.

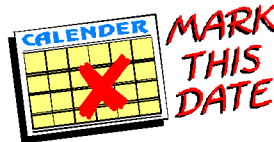
BCA Events

Classroom Clips

Student's in Mrs. Howells's 7 grade class are studying the Algae Kingdom, viewing, drawing and labeling algae slides. They will search for algae in nature. In math they are solving equations with rational numbers.

8th graders are making presentations on the 4 chemical reactions; synthesis, decomposition, single replacement and double replacement, and they are working on graphing in math.

In Ms. Foti's 4th grade, cloud types and weather safety is the new unit of study in science.

In Mrs. Piekarski's 7/8 grade girls Navi class, the students are reviewing the material they learned through self-created PowerPoint presentations, which will be shared in class.
