SPOTLIGHT ON OUR CLASSROOMS

Navi (Mrs. Chaya Hecht) – We are learning about the time period of Yirmiyahu as Hashem sends him to rebuke the Yidden and urge them to do Teshuva. The Yidden are further challenged by "Nevi'ei Sheker"

who come to entice them with false promises of blessings despite their sins. To understand the Jews' gravitation towards these false prophets we discussed the idea of rationalization, how we see ourselves justifying our desires, and how to refocus ourselves in everyday scenarios.

Geometry (Mrs. Salem) – In our geometry class we concluded the Pythagorean Unit with the creation of Theodorus's Wheel. We observed its spiral and contiguous triangles that formed as each triangle hypotenuse grew with a pattern of square roots. The final design resembled a snail or conch shell in nature. Students then made their own decorative Theodorus Wheel with colors and patterns for our classroom wall art.

English (Mrs. Doiny) – Creativity, thoughtfulness, and hard work were on display last week as the BCA English classes celebrated Chanukah (and the culmination of a unit on the stories of Sherlock Holmes) by playing games they created themselves. While all the games were fun and beautifully presented, the definite highlights were "Hound the Suspects", a Clue - based game by Chaya'le Wilhelm and Chana Drizin, and "Mystery at the Manor"; by Libby Vail and Toby Sandman. Additionally, Batya Raskin read her wonderful short story, in which she modernized and adapted a Sherlock Holmes mystery for the 21st century, to gales of laughter from her appreciative audience. Other students presented research on the Victorian era and how it is portrayed in the stories we read. It was gratifying to see the planning, care, and sheer knowledge that the students deployed in producing


Chumash (Mrs. Kalmenson) – 11/12 grades learned about the 6 days of creation culminating with the creation of woman. The idea of עזר כנגדו was studied with multiple commentaries sparking lots of interesting conversations about whether a woman is meant to be an כנגדו or both? We read two fascinating stories from midrash rabbah illustrating examples of both. Drawing on pesukim from קהלת and קהלת the girls are quite intrigued as we delve into whether these are contradictory concepts or not.
